The plan is structured around three main objectives:

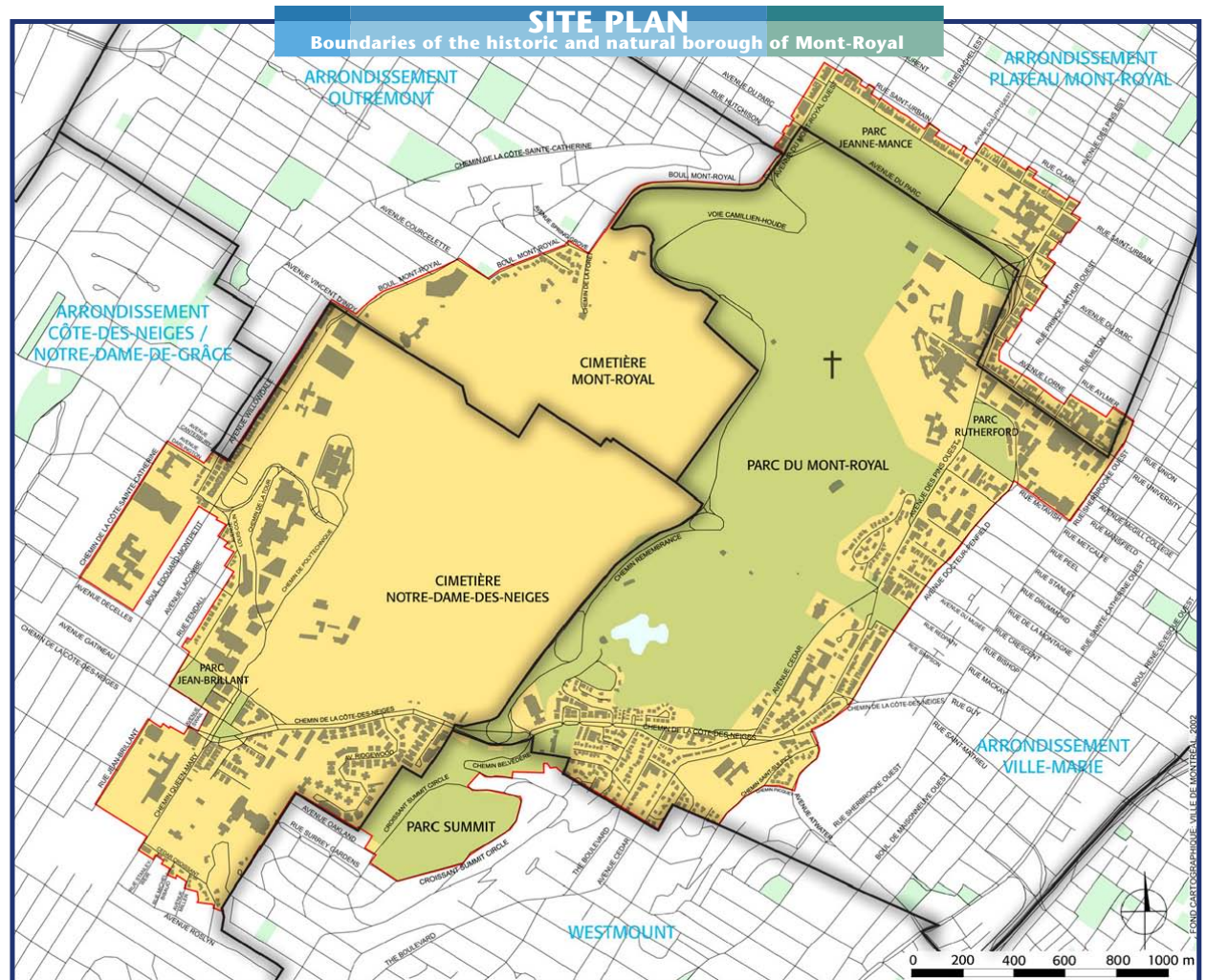
- Ensuring the protection and enhancement of Mount Royal
- Making the mountain accessible and welcoming
- Putting together the conditions required for the protection and enhancement of Mount Royal

The protection and enhancement objective comprises three elements that will be the subject of thematic workshops over the course of the consultation:

- Natural environments
- Built and managed environments
- Landscapes

PURPOSE OF THE CONSULTATION

The implementation of the Mount Royal Protection and Enhancement Plan calls for the adoption of a by-law amending the Montréal Master Plan's complementary document. This will allow entrenchment in the latter of legislative protection and enhancement measures provided for in the Mount Royal Protection and Enhancement Plan and ensure the coherent revision of borough by-laws.
